Will you open the door and let Jesus in today?

“Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me.”—Revelation 3:20.

There was a time in Jesus' life after His resurrection that he was teaching two of His disciples, which did not recognize Him. He was going to leave as they were going to their home, but they constrained Him to stay with them. He would not go into their home without an invitation.

“And they drew nigh unto the village, whither they went: and he made as though he would have gone further. 29 But they constrained him, saying, Abide with us: for it is toward evening, and the day is far spent. And he went in to tarry with them. 30 And it came to pass, as he sat at meat with them, he took bread, and blessed it, and brake, and gave to them. 31 And their eyes were opened, and they knew him; and he vanished out of their sight.”—Luke 24:28-31.

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Who is Jesus, and why is it important that He come into your heart by invitation? He is God, your Creator, who loved you and died to pay for your sins. “All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made.”—John 1:3.
